Prisoner B-3087 by Alan Gratz -

<u>Description:</u> Survive. At any cost. 10 concentration camps. Ten different places where you are starved, tortured, and worked mercilessly. It's something no one could imagine surviving. But it is what Yanek Gruener has to face. As a Jewish boy in 1930s Poland, Yanek is at the mercy of the Nazis who have taken over. Everything he has, and everyone he loves, have been snatched brutally from him. And then Yanek himself is taken prisoner, his arm tattooed with the words PRISONER B-3087.

Maze Runner by James Dashner

<u>Description:</u> When Thomas wakes up in the lift, the only thing he can remember is his name. He's surrounded by strangers—boys whose memories are also gone. Outside the towering stone walls that surround them is a limitless, ever-changing maze. It's the only way out—and no one's ever made it through alive. Then a girl arrives. The first girl ever. And the message she delivers is terrifying: Remember. Survive. Run.

Locomotion by Jacqueline Woodson

<u>Description:</u> When Lonnie was seven years old, his parents died in a fire. Now he's eleven, and he still misses them terribly. And he misses his little sister, Lili, who was put into a different foster home because "not a lot of people want boys-not foster boys that ain't babies." Told entirely through Lonnie's poetry, we see his heartbreak over his lost family, his thoughtful perspective on the world around him, and most of all his love for Lili and his determination to one day put at least half of their family back together.

Uglies by Scott Westerfeld -

<u>Description:</u> The Uglies series has more than 3 million books in print, has been translated into twenty-seven languages, and spent more than fifty weeks on the New York Times bestseller list. Tally's adventures begin in Uglies, where she learns the truth about what life as a Pretty really means. In Uglies, all sixteen-year-old children are required to have cosmetic surgery that will make them "pretty." Tally Youngblood cannot wait to become pretty, but her life changes when she meets Shay, a girl who wants to remain "ugly." Tally lives in a dystopian future where everything is provided.

Divergent by Veronica Roth -

<u>Description:</u> In Beatrice Prior's dystopian Chicago world, society is divided into five factions, each dedicated to the cultivation of a particular virtue—Candor (the honest), Abnegation (the selfless), Dauntless (the brave), Amity (the peaceful), and Erudite (the intelligent). On an appointed day of every year, all sixteen-year-olds must select the faction to which they will devote the rest of their lives. For Beatrice, the decision is between staying with her family and being who she really is—she can't have both.

The Children of Blood and Bone by Tomi Adeyemi

<u>Description:</u> This is a fantasy novel inspired by Nigerian mythology, specifically focusing on the Orisha. In this world, magic is forbidden and those who are descended from the Maji are called "maggots" and systematically oppressed, if not killed outright. Amari, the daughter of King Saran, has to make a very difficult decision.

Boy: Tales of Childhood by Roald Dahl -

<u>Description:</u> Dahl shares tales of his own childhood that are completely fascinating and funny. Did you know that he nearly lost his nose in a car accident? Or that he was once a chocolate candy tester for Cadbury's? Have you heard about his involvement in the Great Mouse Plot of 1924? Sure to captivate and delight you, the boyhood antics of this master storyteller are not to be missed!

<u>Description:</u> When the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan, one girl spoke out. Malala Yousafzai refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. This intriguing novel focuses on Malala's fight for survival and opportunity.
